Para Sport Nova Scotia provides adaptive and inclusive sports to Nova Scotians with disabilities all year round. If you are interested in joining a winter sport, please see some of the options offered below:

- Alpine Skiing: want to learn how to ski through adaptive equipment then you need to become a member with Canadian Adaptive Snow Sports (CADS). They offer lessons at Martock, Wentworth and Ben Eoin ski hills.
- Cross-Country Skiing: individuals looking to incorporate cross-country skiing
 will have the chance during 2019 both at Keppoch Mountain in Antigonish and at
 a new club at Brunello Golf Course.
- Sledge Hockey: there are several different options if you want to get involved
 with sledge hockey; first you can learn to sledge, you can learn to play Para Ice
 Hockey or you can get involved with Competitive Para Ice Hockey. Finally, you
 can also get involved with various recreational skates and borrow adaptive
 equipment for your hockey needs.
- Wheelchair Curling: this program is offered at Lakeshore Curling Club at the Sackville Sports Stadium and the Pictou Curling Club for both beginners and returning curlers.
